He is a past recipient of the Parker Trowbridge Award - Easter Seals' most coveted and highest service award. Alexander also serves on the Investment Committee of Morgan Memorial Goodwill Industries, and, in addition, finds time to volunteer his services to the YWCA of Central Massachusetts and the Worcester Art Museum.

In 2008 more than 100 scouts participated in camping experiences – an average of one camping activity per month for the year. In addition in 2008, 9,800 hours of community service was performed by packs, troops and venturing crews, 14 Scouts were awarded the rank of Eagle and more than 76 tons of food were collected for families in need.
